Re: Resolution & Order No. 2024-338 – ODOT radio site agreement

---

### **Resolution & Order 2024-338:**

This is a radio site agreement with the State of Oregon to use their Buck Mountain radio site for the new VHF Fire Radio System. This site is owned and operated by the Oregon Department of Transportation Wireless Communication Services division. This is a vital site for the new fire radio system that will enhance radio coverage in the southern section of Linn County.

### **Financial Impact:**

The annual fee for this site is \$7,778.37, however, ODOT is providing a credit of \$28,780 for costs we have expended related to remodeling/improving a radio shelter that we will use at the site. The ongoing annual costs will be split by Linn County Fire Agencies through annual agreed-upon billing, and the Linn County Emergency Telephone Agency 911 tax collections.

Of the 29 referrals, 4 represent dependency, 11 status and 13 criminal.

There are currently 197 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 30 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 115 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 81 youth. 75 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

Victim Advocate made 93 contacts.

### **Work Crew**

Tier 1 – 12 youth completed 127 hours of community service in 4 project days. In 2023 11 youth completed 155.25 hours of service during the same time period.

Tier 2 – 16 youth completed 231.0 hours of work crew in 10 project days. In 2023 14 youth completed 384.75 hours of service during the same time period.

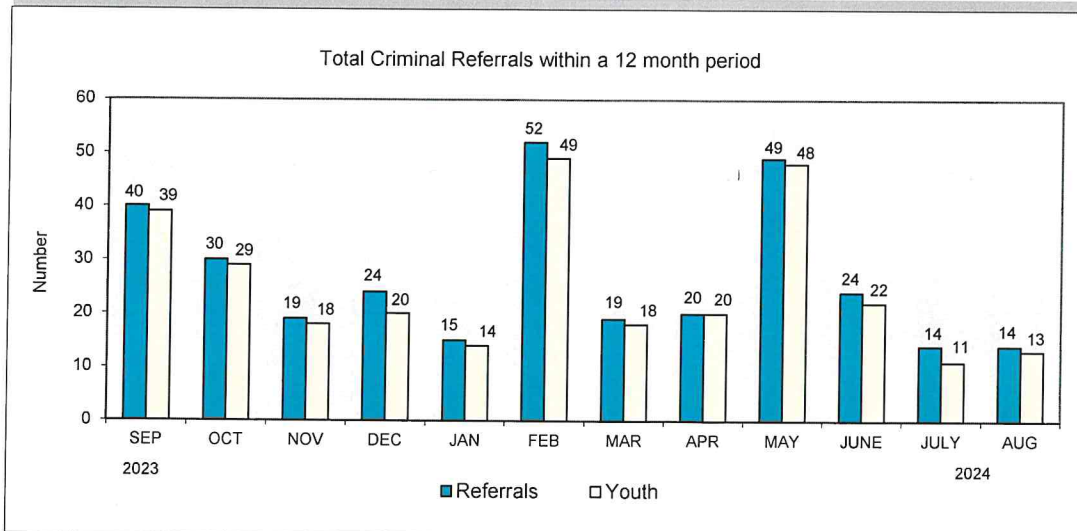

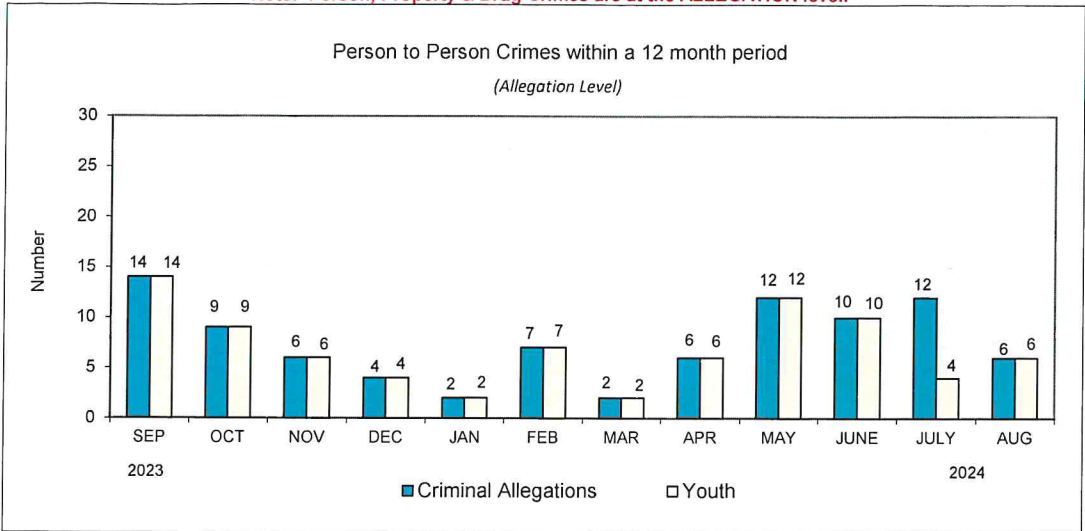

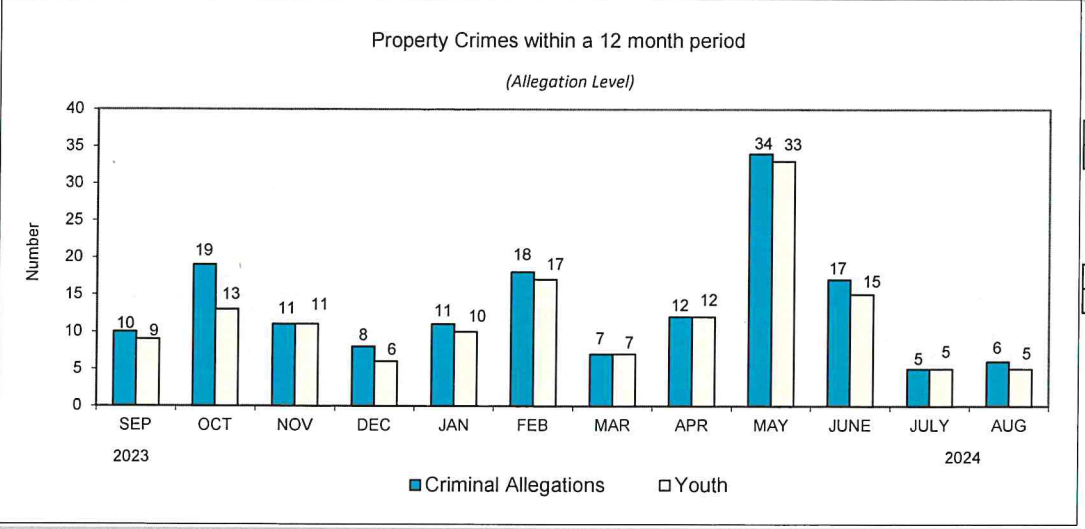

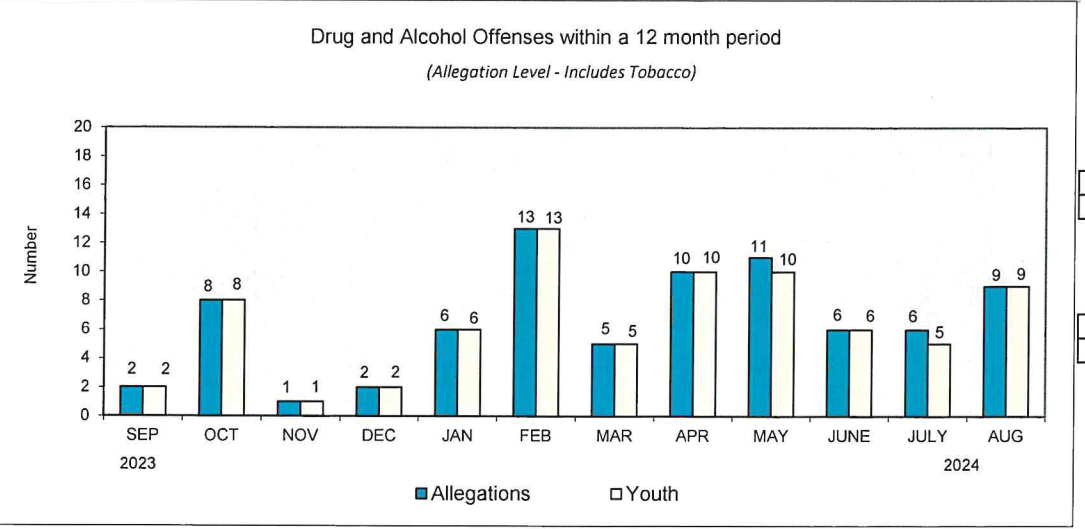

**Resolution & Order No. 2024-336 and Ordinance 2024-337** – PD24-0170: An application by Ron Brockmann for a *Zoning* map amendment. The applicant proposes to amend the Zoning map designation of the subject property from Urban Growth Area – Urban Growth Management (UGA-UGM-20) to Urban Growth Area – Limited Industrial (UGA-LI).

The Board conducted a duly noticed public hearing on this matter on August 20, 2024 and voted 3-0 to approve the application.
